

Out For Education, founded in 1999, provides scholarships to worthy Houstonarea LBGTQ+ Scholars. Previously know as the PFLAG/HATCH Youth Scholarship Foundation, **Out For Education** has awarded more than 500 scholarships in excess of \$2 million. Scholars must pass rigorous qualifications in order to receive funding. Our goal is to build tomorrow's LGBTQ+ leaders. All scholars are required to volunteer in the community of their chosen college or university.

We remain one of Houston's largest LGBTQ+ 501(c)3 non-profit organizations, and we rely on the community for support annually.

DID YOU KNOW

Making it to High School graduation is a challenge, especially for LGBTQ+ students. This is why it is so important for organizations like **Out For Education** to exist. Just review these findings from the 2019 National School Climate Survey from GLSEN.

- 59.1% of LGBTQ students felt unsafe at school because of their sexual orientation.
- 32.7% of LGBTQ students missed at least one entire day of school in the past month because they felt unsafe or uncomfortable. 8.6% missed four or more days in the past month.
- Almost all LGBTQ students (98.8%) heard "gay" used in a negative way at school.
- 87.4% of LGBTQ students heard negative remarks specifically about transgender people.
- 52.4% of students reported hearing homophobic remarks from their teachers or other school staff.
- 68.7% of LGBTQ students experienced verbal harassment at school based on sexual orientation. 56.9%% based on gender expression, and 53.7% based on gender.
- 25.7% of LGBTQ students were physically harassed in the past year based on sexual expression.
- 11% of LGBTQ students were physically assaulted in the past year based on sexual orientation.
- 59.1% of LGBTQ students reported personally experiencing LGBTQ related discriminatory policies or practices at school.

The Effects

- Of the LGBTQ students who indicated that they were considering dropping out of school, a sizable percentage (42.2%) indicated that it was related to the harassment they faced at school.
- Compared to LGBTQ students who did not experience LGBTQ-related discrimination at school, those who experienced discrimination were three times more likely to have missed school in the past month, had lover GPA, were more likely to be disciplined, had lower self-esteem and higher levels of depression.
